





A brief history of the former St. George's and Central Schools

St. George's School



The school was initially founded by the 'National Society' in 1829, under strict specifications that there had to be at least 6 square feet of floor space for each child, with the school rooms being at least 10 feet high. Boys and girls were taught separately in a room divided by a curtain. A typical day included prayers followed by reading, writing, arithmetic and religious instruction.

The school continued to grow and was extended in 1858. Later, St George's became an 'infants and juniors' school, as secondary education was reformed and local authority education departments became more involved. By 1938, 174 pupils were on the roll in School Street. The war years saw the school used as an air-raid shelter and First Aid Centre.

In January 1963, the School Inspector reported that: 'All the staff are on excellent terms with the children whose behaviour and response was most rewarding'. A significant date was that of 5th August 1968, Mr Allan Hilton came to St. George's with his aim, (as was in 1829), 'to educate the children of Tyldesley in the best possible manner'.

In the latter years of the 20th century it became more and more obvious that the physical restraints of the venerable buildings were holding back a modern curriculum and a new school was planned.

Central School



By 1892, the population of Tyldesley had grown to such an extent that a new school was urgently needed at the East end of the town. The Church was anxious that such a school should also serve as a mission, rather than be a Board School (controlled by members of Tyldesley Local Board, the forerunner of the Urban District Council) and so late in 1892 building commenced on Darlington Street School, later to become known locally as 'The Mission School'.

The land was donated by William Ramsden, (a local colliery owner) at a cost of £600. On 22nd October that year, (a grey, rainy Saturday) Mr Ramsden's wife Sarah laid the foundation stone for the new school. The ceremony took place amidst a gathering of local dignitaries and was preceded by a march from St. George's Church, accompanied by a brass band.

The school was opened on 23rd April 1893 with a complement of 215 children and just 2 teachers, all being accommodated in the hall building. The main building was added four years later. On Sunday, the hall was used as a chapel and early photographs show the desks turned into pews, an organ, a lectern and an altar in the apse. Two stained glass windows were in the east wall. One was dedicated to the memory of William Ramsden and the other to the memory of John Kay, manager of the Wellington pit, who was killed in an explosion at the pit in 1895. For many years, John Kay had taken the lead in developing 'Sunday School' and keeping the 'Mission' to its original purpose.

Teaching 'English as a second language' has always been important as so many of the early pupils at the 'Mission' only spoke Welsh at home!

Two other 'church' schools should also be noted as having been part of the local education scene and contributing to our current school's development. The Infant School in Johnson Street forwarded its Junior pupils to St George's for more than 60 years, before St George's Shakerley School was opened in the 1960's and its Headteacher moved to this new school. In the early 2000's attempts were made to create a Federation between St George's Central and Shakerley schools, but sadly with little support and Shakerley was closed in 2007. A self-standing day nursery remains on the site, which became our Lancaster Avenue Nursery site in 2016.

The children will be taught by talented, enthusiastic and caring staff who use their expertise to extend the learning experiences of all children both in our school environment and further afield during trips and activities.

In our school, education is about children experiencing the joy of discovery, solving problems and being creative. We aim to develop their sense of awe and wonder, and their excitement about the world. The curriculum we deliver is characterised by high expectations and is broad, balanced, personalised and skills based – the fusion of excellence and enjoyment. Teaching supports children's individual needs and abilities

As a Church of England School we lay the foundations for life, nurturing spiritual and moral awareness through the study and worship of the Christian Faith, and other faith communities and cultures.

Our school motto of: 'Never settle for less than your best' is at the heart of everything we do in school and, together with parents, carers, governors, the church and local community, each and every child is encouraged to follow this principle.

We pride ourselves on being a warm, caring and inclusive school that constantly works to build partnerships with parents and the local community. Our close work with St. George's Church helps to ensure that Christian Values and respect for others are embedded within the ethos, teaching and daily worship of the school.

Please feel welcome to come and look around the school and meet the staff and children.


