Mrs Yates was also a school governor for 27 years and was in this role when St. George's amalgamated with Tyldesley Central to become the school we know today. It was very humbling to have been nominated for the award in recognition of contributions towards our local community. <u>Hinning House</u> – Next week will see 24 Y5 children from St. George's Central spend a week at Hinning House in the Lake District for their annual residential trip. So that all our children can take part in this experience, we arrange a second trip and so on Monday 3rd February, 9 boys from St. George's Central will join up with 11 children from St. Philip's to make the journey up to the Lakes. The children will be accompanied by staff from school and will spend the week orienteering, canoeing, kayaking as well as many other outdoor and

<u>Safer Internet Day</u> – Mr Simmons has arranged for a theatre group to come into school on Tuesday 11th February to link with Safer Internet day and teach the children about how to stay safe online. Key Stage One classes will have workshops followed by a performance for Key Stage Two. Children will be learning different aspects of E safety in a practical way.

As in previous years, we would like the children at school and Lancaster Avenue Nursery to bring their favourite book to school/nursery to share and to also **dress up as a character from a book**. Classes have planned lots of different reading activities to take place throughout the day and we are also aiming to have a 'guest reader' in each class.



<u>Leigh Harriers Cross Country</u> – Children from St. George's Central recently gave up their Saturday morning to support our school in the fifth 'Graham Jackett Cross Country Challenge'. The 27 St. George's Central children competed against children from eleven other schools over a tough course. Our Y3/4 girls' team won their category and our Y5/6 girls came second in their category which led to our combined girls coming overall second. Thanks to all our children who took part in this event and helped ATSA clinch the Graham Jackett trophy.





Y1 &Y2 Football Competition at MUFC – On Friday 17th January, we took a Y1 and a Y2 football team to The Cliff training Ground in Salford to take part in a football competition against seven other schools. Both our teams did really well and narrowly missed out on qualifying for the finals. Well done to all the children who took part.

<u>Football leagues</u> – This year, there is a mixed football league and a girls' football league and our school has a team in both leagues. Matches will be taking place over the next few months at Fred Longworth each Monday and Friday. Our girls played their first matches earlier this week and did really well, winning one match and narrowly losing the second match.
