### **General questions about English**

Children from Nursery, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 have feedback on English. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is English about?
*Practicing your handwriting.
*Learning to write postcards and letters.
*Learning about different books.
*Getting better at reading.
*Learning about poetry.
*Using capital letters and full stops correctly.
*Using capital letters for proper nouns.
Why is English important?
*To be able to write easily without thinking about punctuation too much.
*So you can spell.
*You might want to be a teacher when you grow up.
*Every subject uses English.
Tell me about your favourite piece of work in English and tell me why you enjoyed learning about this.
*Writing a diary as Samuel Pepys because we produced art work to express our writing.
*Writing about the book Journey because we could find out about the story ourselves using the pictures.
*Writing about the Great Fire of London because I enjoyed Toby and The Great Fire of London.
*Reading the Hedgehog and writing about hedgehogs.
How do you know if you are doing well in English?
*Positive comments off your teachers.
*We have spelling sheets to check our spellings to help us edit our writing.
*Show other teachers our work.
*Team points.
*Checking for what we have been asked to include in our work e.g. adjectives, noun phrases.
What happens if you are finding work difficult in English?
*Have another think about what we are writing.
*Use the spelling sheet to help.
*Ask a friend or teacher for help.
What do you need to do to improve your learning in English?
*Being more independent when I'm writing.
*Spelling tricky words.
*Checking my writing make sense.
*Getting more writing done in a lesson.
Recently, you completed some work on the text Journey in English, what can you tell me about it?
*It's a wordless book.
*You can tell your own story writing the pictures instead of the author telling you.
*You can use the pictures to write your own paragraphs about what's happening.
*You can write your own story.
*Children were able to retell the story from details in the picture.
Can you explain what some of this English vocabulary means?
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Capital letter – used at the start of a sentence and for proper nouns. Full stop – put them at the end of a sentence. Question mark – use at the end of a question. Questions start with how, what, why, when, where and who.
