Feedback from LKS2 children about English (June 2023)

General questions about English

Children from Nursery, Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 have feedback on English. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is English about?

- *Learning about spelling, grammar, plurals etc.
- *Learning about different types of writing e.g. stories, non-fiction texts, information texts.
- *Learning different poems and performing them.
- *Learning to read and write.

Why is English important?

- *To use reading in our everyday lives.
- *To help you get a job when you're older.
- *To help you learn in all the other subjects.

Tell me about your favourite piece of work in English and tell me why you enjoyed learning about this.

- *Writing a mystery story because we have read lots of mystery stories and these have been interesting and helped us to get ideas for our own writing.
- *Drawing a wanted poster of Macavity linked our poem because I liked linking art to English.
- *Exploring the meaning of different poems and learning new vocabulary.

Are there any areas in English that you are still unsure about?

- *Describing settings in stories.
- *Remembering details from stories we've read.
- *Remembering all of the spelling rules.

How do you know if you are doing well in English?

- *Positive comments on our work.
- *Team points in our books.
- *Getting praised for a piece of work.
- *Certificate in assembly 'Star of the Week'.
- *'Super Writer' Award.
- *All the school clapping for us when we have performed our poems.
- *We take our books and writing to Mrs Malley to show her.

What happens if you are finding work difficult in English?

- *Ask an adult in the room for some support.
- *Ask an adult to explain it again or repeat what we need to do.
- *Work with a partner or a group.

What do you need to do to improve your learning in English?

- *Remembering all the names of different types of grammar.
- *Get better at using speech in stories.
- *Get better at spellings.
- *Adding more detail to setting descriptions.
- *Learning how to use commas.

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In the Summer Term, you learned about mystery stories, what can you tell me about these?

- *They have suspects and motives and sometimes murderers.
- *There are clues for the reader to solve.
- *We have read Macavity and I Know What You Did Last Wednesday.
- *They have pictures in.
- *It is written in paragraphs.
- *It has speech and description.

If you were to design your own character for a mystery story and write a description again, what would you do differently?

- *Improve my spellings.
- *I would make my character scarier because my character was a murderer.
- *I would change the appearance of my characters to make them more mysterious.
- *I would choose some more interesting words to use in my writing.

Can you explain what some of this English vocabulary means?

Adjective – a word that describes a noun.

Noun – a person, a place or a thing.

Adverb – a word that describes a verb. It can be an ly word.

Verb – a doing word e.g. running, jumping.

Conjunction – a word that joins two parts of a sentence.

Comma – it separates things in a list. It's at the end of a fronted adverbial.

Inverted commas – Used to show when someone is talking.

Fronted adverbial – It shows us when, who, how, where or why something happens. It has a comma at the end and comes at the

beginning of the sentence.

Clause – a part of the sentence that makes sense is a main clause and a part of a sentence that doesn't make sense is a subordinate

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Can you think where this learning link to things that you have learned before in English with a different teacher?

- *Using speech in adventure stories.
- *We looked at the same story structure as stories we have looked at before.

Subject specific questions about English

What is your favourite text that you studied? Why?

- *The World's Worst Teachers because I enjoyed writing descriptions on Doctor Dread.
- *Coming to England because we linked artwork to our writing.
- * The poem Macavity because it had lots of description and we learned lots about the character of Macavity.

What are the features of a mystery story?

- *Victim
- *Motives
- *Murder
- *Speech
- *Paragraphs
- *Clues

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What different texts have you looked at in book talk?

- *An Octopus Story
- *Songs
- *Poems Macavity

What could we do to make our library better or encourage more people to visit?

- *Make posters to show when the library is open.
- *Library buddies.

Action to take as a result of Pupil Feedback on English

- *Purchase and follow a new spelling scheme.
- *Key phase spelling competitions.
- *Hold reading competitions in the library.
