- Mary Seacole lived an exciting life. She travelled to many different countries and helped soldiers in war.
- When Mary Seacole died in 1881, her story was mostly forgotten. But today, Mary Seacole is very well known. She was brave and very determined.
- Mary Seacole went to a battlefield to help soldiers. She looked after them in her 'hotel'. This wasn't like a hotel you would stay in on your holidays. It was just a hut made from metal.
- Edith Cavell was born on 4th December 1865 in Swardston, Norfolk. She trained as a nurse and was made matron at a nursing school in Brussels.
