

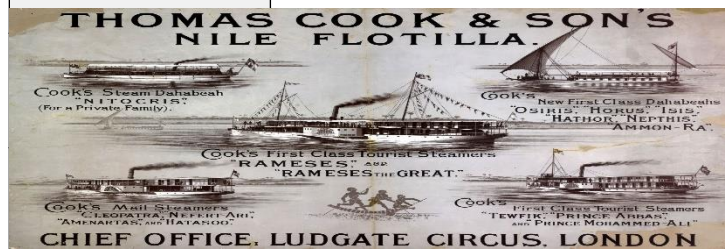
How have holidays changed in the last 100 years?

seaside holidays	People have been going on seaside holidays for over a hundred years.



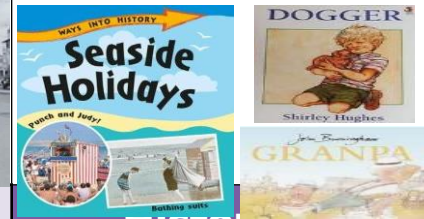
Sticky Knowledge about history within living memory
