## ¿Qué habitaciones hay en mi casa? (What rooms are in my house?)



### Main questions and replies:

*¿Vives en una casa o en un piso?* – Do you live in a house or a flat?

*Vivo en una casa* – I live in a house.

You could also link knowledge of numbers and use a conjunction in your reply, e.g.

*Vivo en una casa con tres dormitorios, un salón y un comedor.*

I live in a house with three bedrooms, a lounge and a dining room.

### Remember:

The names of all of the different rooms of a house and items within those rooms are nouns, just as in English.

In Spanish, all nouns are either masculine or feminine.

Masculine nouns use el/un (the/a) before them while feminine nouns use la/una (the/a) before them.

Generally if a noun is feminine it ends in an 'a', however there are exceptions to this rule.
