

Key vocabulary:

Arrangement – Thinking about how the music will be played in terms of layers.

Band – A group of musicians playing music together.

Chord – Playing more than one note simultaneously.

Compose – Making up a new piece of music.

Lyrics – The words of the song.

Melody – The 'tune' of the music.

Pattern – A repeating sequence of notes or chords.

Perform – Playing music in front of an audience.

Rhythm – A pattern of sounds in relation to a steady beat.









Structure – The order in which the piece of music will be performed.

Vocals – The parts of the music that are sung.
