



Feedback from Key Stage 1 children about RE (June 2022)

General questions about RE

Children from Key Stage 1 have feedback on RE. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is RE about?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Learning about God and Jesus.• About things from the Bible.
Why is RE important?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• So that we will know about Jesus.• So that we will know about the Bible - the Old and New Testaments.
Tell me about your favourite piece of work in RE and tell me why you enjoyed learning about this
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We liked learning about Easter symbols.• We also enjoyed learning about Jesus as a friend (this is because they were about Christianity and Jesus is important to us).
Are there any areas in RE that you are still unsure about?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Bible as a library because it was a long time ago. (Autumn 1)• What is a synagogue like? (because we didn't spend very long on it).
How do you know if you are doing well in RE?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I would be listening and see what the teacher has written in my book.
What happens if you are finding work difficult in RE?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I would ask my teacher what we were doing and what was the best way to do it.
What do you need to do to improve your learning in RE?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I could listen more.• If I saw a synagogue I might remember it.
In January, you completed some work on Jesus being special, what can you tell me about it?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• He made more bread for the 5000, Jesus calmed the storm to help his disciples. This showed he was special because miracles show he had the Holy Spirit.
If you were to complete this work again, what would you do differently?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We could do some different stories.
Can you explain what some of this RE vocabulary means?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Disciples were the people who followed Jesus. Ascension is when Jesus went back to heaven.
Can you think where this learning link to things that you have learned before in with a different teacher?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• In Y1 we did some different stories about Jesus.

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Subject specific questions about RE

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What similarities/differences have you seen between different religions?

- They both have decorated windows and candles. A synagogue has an Ark but a church has a font and pews.

How often do you get to think about your beliefs/values in class?

- We sometimes think about that.

How does learning about different religions and belief systems help us to understand our society?

- I believe that God is always with me and doing good things.

Action to take as a result of Pupil Feedback on RE

- Liaise with staff to look at ways to incorporate more practical elements to improve recall.
- Ask staff to make specific links to prior learning and remind pupils about this before new content is added.
- Continue to stress the importance of vocabulary.
