To add bullet points and numbering to a text To insert text boxes into a word document	<ul> <li>Fun Facts:</li> <li>Word 1997 introduced "The Office Assistant," also known as "Clippit" and also nicknamed "Clippy." This tool looked like a little paperclip that popped up when he thought he could offer a "tip" about how to use Word</li> <li>The program was first released in 1981. Many of the ideas and features in Microsoft Word came from Bravo, the first graphical writing program. Microsoft bought the Bravo program, and changed its name to <i>Microsoft Word</i>.</li> <li>Although it was not very popular when it came out, it had a feature called <i>WYSIWYG</i> (What You See Is What You Get), which meant that people can change the visual style of writing (e.g. bold, italics), by clicking on buttons, when in other programs like WordPerfect, people had to add special 'codes' to change the style of writing. <i>WYSIWYG</i> is now a common feature of all computer writing programs.</li> </ul>
