General questions about Computing

Children from Key Stage 1 have feedback on Computing. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is Computing about?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We learn how to use computers.• We do coding.• We write stories on the computers.• We use a keyboard to type.
Why is Computing important?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• To be better at Computing.• To learn about lots of things online.• We need to be able to use computers for when we go into Juniors.
Tell me about your favourite piece of work in Computing and tell me why you enjoyed learning about this
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Story maps – We drew pictures about a story and I like drawing on the computer.• Made Stories – We used animation and I like to see the picture move.• Word – I like typing on the keyboard.
Are there any areas in Computing that you are still unsure about?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• I would like to type faster.• I find coding tricky so I want to get better at that.
How do you know if you are doing well in Computing?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We do the task and finish it on time.• Our teacher tells us we've done well.
What happens if you are finding work difficult in Computing?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• We ask the teacher.• We ask a friend to help us.• Sometimes Purple Mash explains.
What do you need to do to improve your learning in Computing?
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Practice using the keyboard and other programs.• We could do more practice at home.
Last term, you completed some work on Word in Computing, what can you tell me about it?

If you were to complete this work again, what would you do differently?

- Font – Change your writing – **Correct**.
Key – Button on the keyboard – **Correct**.
Double click – Click your mouse two time quick – **Correct**.
Cursor – Show where the mouse is on the screen – **Correct**.
Open – Finding something on the computer – **Incorrect**.

- We like using it and watching the videos in assembly.
- We like changing the backgrounds.
- Filming helps us be confident.

What improvements would you like to see in Computing?

- Use tablets more in class like the Juniors.
- Have a set place in the computing suite.
- New computers, sometimes they break.
