Feedback from children about Phonics in KS1 September 2022

General questions about Phonics

What is Phonics about?	
*We learn sounds.	
*We practise tricky words.	
*We look at sounds like ay and ch.	
Why is Phonics important?	
*It helps us to read and spell.	
*It helps us to practise and if we struggle we can get better.	
Tell me about your favourite part of phonics lessons and why you enjoy this.	
*Reading a sentence is my favourite part.	
*Practising tricky words is my favourite part because it helps me in my writing.	
*I like writing the sounds in our book at the end because it helps me to practise.	
How do you know if you are doing well in Phonics?	
*I can use the right spellings in my writing.	
*The teachers say we have done well.	
What happens if you are finding Phonics difficult?	
*We can look at the things on the wall – the child pointed to the alphabet frieze.	
*Think about the phonics I have learnt.	
*Ask the teacher.	
What do you need to do to improve your learning in Phonics?	
*Do it lots of times.	
*Keep practising.	
*Practise at home.	
What can you tell me about some of the work you have done in Phonics since coming back in September?	
*Letter sounds.	
*Tricky words.	
*One child named sounds they head learnt such as <u>ay</u> and <u>ch</u> and <u>ear</u> .	
How does Phonics help you in other lessons or link to other areas of school?	
*So we know how to spell and read other words.	
*Read other words - we established with some prompting and adult discussion that the child meant read in other areas of	the
curriculum.	

Subject specific questions about Phonics

Can you explain what these terms mean?

*Phoneme – children were unsure.

*Grapheme – one child said "when you write it" but on the whole they were unsure.

*Digraph – two letters, one sound.

*Trigraph – three letters, one sound.

*Blending – saying the sounds together.

*Segmenting – children were unsure, they gave an example of it i.e. c/a/t but struggled to actually explain the meaning.

'Never settle for less than your best'

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Action to take as a result of Pupil Feedback on Phonics

*Continue to provide children with opportunities in phonics.

*Further reinforce the meaning of terminology such as phoneme, grapheme, segmenting and blending.

*Ensure children know the names of what they use to help them i.e. alphabet display so that this is clear in their feedback.

* Continue to make links back to the importance of phonics in terms of reading and the wider curriculum.
