Many children in our area are entitled to funding to attend nursery – which means they can come for all or part of the week for FREE! People may not be aware of this and so if you know anyone with a 2 or 3 year old child, ask them to contact our School Business Manager, Mrs Smith on 01942 883773 and she will do all the necessary checks and add your child's name to our ever growing lists.





<u>Parents/carer meetings and workshops</u> – Many thanks to everyone who attended our recent meetings and workshops. These have included an Early Learning Goals session for Reception, a SATs meeting for Y2, a 'drop in' meeting for Y6 regarding the London residential, a HT forum session for KS2 and a Specific Parent Partnerships workshop for Nursery. On Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May, there is a session for Y1 parents/carers about the

upcoming Phonics screening check that Y1 children will undertake in June. Look out for the letter after Easter inviting you to this.



<u>Church events</u> – Many thanks to everyone who has recently attended, or supported, school events in St. George's Church. It was great to see our school choir perform at the Rotary Club 'Shoebox' service – many thanks for all your donations to help fill our shoeboxes with gifts for this. It was great to see so many children and staff at church on



Mothering Sunday. This morning our KS2 children walked to church to take part in our very own Easter service.

This involved the children singing Easter hymns with each class leading a section of the service to help focus on the Easter story. Thanks to everyone involved in organising and leading these events.



<u>PTFA events</u> – It was great to see so many of you at the Easter Bingo that took place earlier this week. Thanks to your support, we raised £211.80 Many thanks to all our PTFA members who organised and supported this event. In a change of date, our next PTFA meeting will be at 6:30pm, Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> May at The Gatehouse Pub where we will

be discussing further ideas to raise funds. Everyone is welcome, I hope to see you there.

<u>Thank you</u> – Many thanks for the recent support/donations over the last few weeks. Although I had mixed up some of the dates, this did not stop you fully supporting all of our events. This included: World Book Day, your £1's donations for Comic Relief and Easter egg donations for non – uniform day. For Comic Relief, we raised over £240. Your Easter egg donations were used as prizes for the Easter Egg Hunt that took place today. Huge thanks for all your support with these events.





<u>Shakerley Fun Day</u> – There will be a variety of fun activities taking place on the Shakerley estate on **Tuesday 16**<sup>th</sup> **April (12pm – 3pm)** which will involve some of our school staff. Our Lancaster Avenue Nursery will be open for you to have a look around and there will be lots of other activities including an Easter egg hunt, 'beat the goalie', circus skills, guess how many sweets in the jar, guess the name of the teddy, craft activities, a climbing wall and much more. We hope to see you there.

<u>Price increases</u> – When we return to school there will be some small price increases with our school breakfast club and our school lunches. Therefore, from Tuesday 23<sup>rd</sup> April, the following prices will apply:

Breakfast Club: Arrive between 7:30am and 7:55am: £4.00 per day

Arrive after 7:55am: £3.50 per day

School dinners: £2.35 per day (£11.75 per week)

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<u>Hinning House assembly</u> – On Monday 29<sup>th</sup> April, children from Year 5, who went to Hinning House in January/February, will be leading a short assembly to feedback on their experience of their week in the Lake District. All parents/carers are invited to come and watch this as we feel this may be a good opportunity for parents/carers of younger children to find out more about our Y5 residential. The assembly will start at 9:15am and will last approximately 30 minutes. I hope to see you there.





<u>Staying open!</u> – Although school will still be used as a Polling Station on <u>Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2019</u> for the Local Government Elections, our school will <u>REMAIN OPEN on this day!</u> Like last year, the largest room in our new extension will be used for this. Should you use our school for voting purposes on the day, then please use the gate on 'Peel Hall' side of school and walk down to the extension where you will be able to cast your vote.

During week beginning Monday 13<sup>th</sup> May, all Year 6 children will be undertaking KS2 National tests – a timetable for the week will be sent home to children in Year 6. These tests are externally marked with the final outcomes being returned to school in July so that results can be sent home in your child's annual report. Please ensure children arrive at school in good time each day, well rested and ready to do their best.

During week beginning Monday 20<sup>th</sup> May, children in Y1, Y3, Y4 and Y5 will be undertaking end of year tests. Each class will have their own timetable for these. The tests are marked and moderated in school with the final outcomes sent home in your child's annual report.

<u>Staffing updates</u> – I am pleased to inform you that Miss Booth, one of our Reception teachers, is expecting her first child and will be leaving our school to start her maternity leave at the end of the summer term. Mrs Ramsdale, our teaching assistant in Y1TL is also expecting her first child and will also be leaving us for a little while at the end of the summer term. A full and final staffing list will be included on the newsletter sent home on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> July.
