School Books and presentation – In order to support our transition activities across school and ensure that your child makes an effective start to their learning in September, when they return to school on Monday 3rd June, every child from Reception – Y5 will be starting their new 'September' exercise books in each subject area. This will support your child's new teacher in September as they will be able to look back at the standard of work your child has produced in their final six weeks of their previous year group. We are continually looking at ways to improve things at our school and starting books in June has worked well for us over the last few years. This year, as a result of some training that we have recently undertaken, we will be introducing some different style exercise books for some subjects which we think will help your child improve handwriting and presentation of their work. We will be having a parent/carer workshop about this at various times on **Tuesday 2nd July** – see the letter from Miss Glassbrook nearer the time. As usual, exercise books will be sent home at the end of the year, with a sample of school books being kept by class teachers.

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Fundraising events in school – Many thanks for your fantastic support with the Justicia, Fair Trade stall last week. With your support, we managed to raise **£279.15** and children learned more about the importance of Fair Trade products. During the first week back in school, there will be lots of fundraising events in school that your children will



be involved in. On Tuesday 4th June, the NSPCC will be visiting school to work with our children and launch our 'Speak out, Stay safe' fund raising event – more details will follow about this. On Friday 7th June, we will be joining other schools across Wigan in having a non-uniform day to support the local charity 'Real Change', which aims to raise awareness about the issues of homelessness. All money raised will be spent locally to support people who are currently homeless or who are at risk of becoming homeless.



Skate Park idea – It was great to see Director of Children's Services, Mr Winterbottom, in our community recently to meet with Y5 pupil, Joshua Wallwork, to discuss his idea to have a skate park on the Union Street Park in Tyldesley. If we want children to care for their community and look after it as the future generation, then I think it is imperative we listen to, and work with, them. We visited the park so Joshua could explain his idea and he is now looking to get together a group of children from all schools to join him on a 'working party' group to meet with Mr Winterbottom again before the end of the school year in order to move this project on to the next stage. I will keep you updated.


Sun Protection in school – I hope some of the recent good weather continues over the May half term break from school.

As we outlined in the last newsletter, there are some steps you can take to help protect your child from the sun whilst at school. As children will be outside for a relatively short period of the day we advise that they should come to school with a water bottle, a sun hat and sun glasses and that any sun cream should be applied at home before children come to school so that re-application in school will not be necessary. We will adapt any outdoor activities within our Early Years and PE sessions and children will be encouraged to drink from their water bottles on a regular basis throughout the day.



Updated policies – We have recently emailed you with some of our school policies that we had reviewed and amended. Some of the changes we have already made have been around the requirement for schools to educate children around the many different types of bullying that people could experience (including relating to race, background, disability and sexual orientation). This is not something that is new practice for our school, all we have done is simply make more specific reference to it in our policies. Please be assured that all the work we undertake with your children is always age appropriate and carefully planned so that sensitive topics can be discussed in a way that children can relate to. Ultimately we want to teach children awareness, tolerance, respect and acceptance of others so they are able to understand and relate to a wide range of people, within the framework of our Christian ethos and statutory expectations. We have always discussed with children how incorrect use of language and terminology can cause hurt and upset others and we will continue to do this, as and when it is appropriate. The Department for Education has recently announced statutory changes to policies around relationships and sex education. These changes will come into effect from September 2020 and so in September 2019 we will be reviewing our sex and relationships policy, in consultation with all members of our school community, and we will keep you updated on this. In the meantime if you have any questions or queries, please feel free to contact me in school.

KS2 end of year production – Rehearsals for Y6 children have begun and children now know the part they will be playing in the end of year KS2 production. Y6 children will now need to spend the half term break learning their lines so that upon their return to school, they can 'polish' off their performance by practicing on stage without the need for scripts. We are planning to have **two performances: Monday 8th July (1:45pm) and Wednesday 10th July (6pm)**. Although Y6 make up the main actors for this performance, the children from Y3, Y4 and Y5 play a major role in making up the choir that sings all the songs during the play (which is a key aspect as the songs help to tell the story). Pop these dates in your diary and look out for the letter coming out after half term. Details about tickets, and the order they will be sold in, is included on the dates letter attached to this newsletter/email.



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Music alive – Children in Y2 – Y5 will experience a visit on Wednesday 5th June from a group of musicians from Wigan Music Service who will perform a number of musical pieces, using string instruments. Should your child be interested in learning a musical instrument through school then contact the school office.



London residential – Thursday 6th June will see 30 Y6 children and four staff members from school set off early in the morning on our residential trip to London. This is the third time we are undertaking this trip with our children and they will experience a bus tour of London, a boat tour on the Thames, a trip to the theatre to watch the musical 'Aladdin', a visit to London Dungeons and a London Eye Experience. I am sure our children will have a great time away from home.

ATHOS music concert – On Thursday 6th June, our school choir will be setting off from school early to take part in the second ATHOS Music Festival at St. Stephen's Church. This event will involve performances from other local schools and will start at 10:00am. All parents/cares are welcome to attend this event.



Y1/2 Phonics tests – During week beginning Monday 10th June, the children in Y1 and some children in Y2 will undertake a phonics test. This will be delivered by staff in school and will involve the children being tested on their knowledge of the sounds of letters, and groups of letters, within words. The children are typically asked to say the sound/word from a given list. There is a national standard that children are expected to achieve – your child's result will be included in their end of year report that will be sent out in July.

Reception and Nursery Worship – At 9:15am on **Friday 21st June, both Reception classes** will join together for their Class Worship in our school hall. **Friday 28th June will be the turn of the Nursery children**, who again will come to the school hall for a 9:15am Class Worship. On both days, all parents/carers and wider family members are invited to attend as the children showcase their learning and you will be invited to remain in school for a 'stay and play' session following the Worship, should you wish.
