
St George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery

<u>Nursery and Reception</u> – It is great to see and hear about how our Nursery and Reception children have settled into life at our school. The children have been interacting well with each other, making new friends, learning the new routines and enjoying a variety of learning experiences. We would also like to thank you all for your support with our home visits during the first week in September.



<u>Tour of Britain</u> – Many thanks to all our families who came along to join with the local community on Saturday 14th
September to watch as the Tour of Britain Cycle Race came close by our school. Our artwork on the school field was even shown on TV for all to see! I am sure that those of you who came along were not only blown away by the speed and effort the cyclists were putting in for the race.......but also by the



amount of spare bikes the teams had on top of all the support cars following! I am sure the event was something that will live long in the memory of everyone who came along.

<u>Target booklets</u> – If your child is in Y1 –Y6 then you will have received your copy of their Autumn Term target booklet last Friday. Nursery and Reception children will be bringing theirs home today. End of year targets have been set for your child in different subjects/areas. Teachers have then selected key objectives for the term that will support your child to achieve these targets. It is really important that you work with your child to support them so that they achieve or exceed their end



of year targets. Reading at home with your child (as least 3 times a week) and ensuring they complete and return any other home learning activities that are set will support your child to meet these targets.



NEW KS2 Fit:Hit — We consulted with KS2 children, at the end of last year, about how we could develop the use of the gym equipment on our playground so that it was well used by all KS2 children. Using ideas from the children and more recently, from staff in school, we have come up with 'Fit:Hit playtimes' each Tuesday and Thursday. On these days, at playtime, the children will all have the opportunity to use the gym equipment and also take part in some running activities, before they then have their snack and a chat with their friends. This will be starting next week.

There is no need to send any different footwear in school for this as children have been running and playing on the equipment for a long time as it is, however, should they feel more comfortable, children could change into their pumps/trainers on these days. Mrs Cunningham will be organising the 'Fit:Hit playtimes' and Mr Cooke will soon be training play leaders to lead activities on the gym equipment at lunchtimes.

<u>Harvest Festival</u> – Last Sunday, children from our school started our Harvest celebrations by taking part in the 10:30am church service at St. George's Church. Thank you to everyone who came along to support this – it was a great see so many of you! This morning, Rector Martin led our service in school for Reception and KS1 children and families and then returned this afternoon to lead a service for KS2. Again, it was great to see so many of you in school supporting our events today. Many thanks to

everyone who donated gifts as part of our Harvest celebrations. Next week we will start to combine gifts into Harvest hampers and distribute them to the nominated people within the local community.

<u>London Residential trip</u> – We recently held a meeting for the parents/carers of children in Y6 as, we will again be taking our oldest children to spend some time in London next June. The trip will be a great experience for these children as they near the end of their time at our school.





<u>Open afternoon</u> – This year's first open afternoon with headteacher forum will be on **Tuesday 1st October** (1:30pm start) and will be for **Nursery**, **Reception and KS1 parents/carers only.** If your child is in these classes then you are invited into school to spend the first part of the afternoon in your child's class. For the second part of the afternoon you are welcomed into the school hall/library to enjoy some refreshments and there is the opportunity to ask me questions about school life. It's quite an informal afternoon and provides you with the opportunity to gain an insight into life at our school. There will be an additional 'Stay

and Play' for Nursery parents/carers during the same week on **Thursday 3rd October, in the morning**. Come to the main school entrance once you have dropped your child off should you wish to stay for this.

<u>PTFA meeting</u> – The first Parent, Teachers and Friends Association meeting of the year will be taking place in **school at 3:30pm on Wednesday 2nd October**. You are all very welcome to attend as we look for ideas about how we can raise money to provide some of the 'extra' things in school. A crèche will be provided



should you require it for your child while you are at the meeting. Things that we are looking for our PTFA to support this year include: our Eco club as they develop different areas around school, the annual **FREE** trip to watch the pantomime at the Manchester Opera House for children in Reception to Year 6 as well as other things to enhance life at our school.



School photographer – We will receive our first visit of the year from the school photographer on Monday 7th October. Children with <u>pre-school</u> brothers and sisters who do not attend our nursery, and nursery children who do not usually attend on a Monday morning can come into school from 8:30am to have their photographs taken. If the younger sibling attends our Lancaster Avenue Nursery, please bring them at 8:30am to school to have their photograph taken with their sibling attending school. All other photographs will be taken during the school day. The photographer will be visiting our Lancaster Avenue Nursery on the same day, again, during the morning. As at

school, if any children there want their photograph taken with younger siblings, please arrive at the nursery for 8:30am. Please make any arrangements with Ms Naughton at the nursery office. Photographs can be taken with siblings, in family groups and also individually. A letter will be sent home to school based children next week so that you can indicate your preferred choice of photos.

<u>Parent/carer questionnaires</u> – Many thanks for all the '3 stars and a wish' questionnaires that were returned to me in school before the summer break, in July. I have now had the chance to read through all of them and your child will come home tonight with a copy of the comments received and the school's response to your comments. <u>Parents' evening</u> – You are invited to come into school to discuss your child's start to the school year with their class teacher on <u>Monday 14th October 3:30pm – 6:30pm OR Tuesday 15th October 3:30pm – 6:30pm.</u> In order that we can accommodate everyone, you will be asked to select a time slot most convenient to yourselves. We will then collate the requests taking care to ensure that those with more than one child have appointments that suit. Your confirmed times will then be sent out to you. Please ensure that you arrive at the school's main entrance 5 minutes before your allocated



time and take a seat in the area provided. The meeting with your child's teacher will take place in the school hall with a strict time limit of 10 minutes. I will be available in the school hall on both evenings should you need to speak to me – no appointment will be necessary for this. Appointment letters are being sent out on Monday and are due to be returned to your child's teacher by Friday 4th October, with confirmed times being sent home, on Wednesday 9th October.
