<u>Newsletter – Friday 3rd July 2020</u>



In our last newsletter on Friday 12th June, I focused on ensuring that everyone was fully aware of our plan with regards to our wider opening school to children in **Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 6** (as well as other identified children). Since we opened to more children, I have felt so proud of the way that everyone has worked hard to ensure that things have run smoothly. I felt a great sense of pride on Monday 15th June 2020 as I stood outside school and I saw the look on children's faces – I don't think I appreciated the significance of that moment in time as we started to return to some kind of 'normality' for some of our children. As staff, we have all certainly missed the 'hum and buzz' of a working school. In school, your children have adapted well and have been great!

We have also had to adapt as a governing body, as our April and June meetings have taken place via Zoom which has been a totally new experience for me. Our staff in school have adapted their usual ways of working, some working in different classrooms, with different children whilst at the same time ensuring that home learning packs are ready to send out each week. Our staff have also been working hard to adapt our approaches to many of the special events that usually take place at this time of year that are unique in the life of a child.



<u>Nursery Worship</u> – It was planned that our Nursery children from Darlington Street would celebrate their learning and time in our Nursery with their Class Worship in our school hall today. Unfortunately, this alongside many other events, has had to be cancelled. Our Nursery Worship is a significant event for me as some of the children in this group will not be returning to us in September and so it would have been the final time that all the children would have been together as a whole cohort. Therefore may I take this opportunity to wish all our Nursery children good luck as they start Reception in September. For the children

starting at new schools, we will always remember you as being part of our school and we hope you remember us too. May I also personally take this opportunity to thank all the Nursery parents/carers who have been so supportive of our school this year. Your positive feedback has been much needed and appreciated. <u>Annual Reports and School books</u> – Children in school will receive their annual school report to bring home on Friday 10th July. Please note, we will not be posting any reports out and so if your child is not currently attending school, you can come and collect their report from the school office, from 2pm onwards on that day. This will be the same for school books, which will be either be sent home with children on Friday 10th July or they can be



collected by you. We are required to keep a sample of books as evidence of work completed in previous academic years. Therefore a small number of children will not bring some of their books home this time. Teachers will let you know if this is the case for your child and you will be contacted to come and collect the books next year. For children in current Reception – current Year 5, along with their report, they will also have a letter informing them which class and which teacher they will have in September. We are looking into class teachers sharing a video via their Twitter pages to introduce themselves to the children. Look out for these over the coming weeks. As part of our usual transition to new classes, children would spend a day in their new class in July. Instead, we have already factored in a longer transition period for when our children return fully to school in September. As our teachers are now working with specific groups of children, it is difficult to release people to make phone calls home or to undertake home visits. However, if during the weekend after receiving the report, you feel your child would benefit from either of these, then please contact our school office by 12pm on Monday 13th July and we will do our best to arrange either a phone call or a short 'door step' visit with their new teacher.
