based 'swimming', cycling and running sessions. On the second day, we were lucky enough to receive a visit from 2019 Ironman UK winner, Kelly Warrington. Children in Year 5 and Year 6 were able to ask a 'real' triathlete some questions about her magnificent achievement in swimming 2.4 miles in 1 hour 5 minutes, cycling 112 miles in 6 hours 19 minutes and running 26.2 miles (a marathon!) in 3 hours 28 minutes...without stopping! <u>Annual Reports and School books</u> – Your child's annual school report will be sent home on **Friday 9th July**. As usual with our reports, there is an opportunity for you to comment and let us know any thoughts and feedback on the year as a whole. This last half term, all children have started their new school books that they will take with

<u>KS2 end of year production</u> – Rehearsals for Y6 children are now well under way for the end of year KS2 production. This will start to gather pace over the next few weeks as the stage will be set up in the hall. As you know from the previous newsletter, due to guidance and spacing in our hall, we will be filming the Y6 children on stage and children in Y3 – Y5 singing the songs in class groups so that there will be a YouTube clip of the final performance ready for you to view on **Friday 16**th **July**.
