


St George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery

Information for September 2021

Last week, children in current Reception to Year 5, spent two days in their September 2021 classes with their new teachers. This provided us in school with an opportunity to work to some of our timings that will be in place next year (lunches etc). As you can see below, our timings for opening doors next year have been amended slightly. We have made suggestions with regards to the gates you can use to enter and leave our school site. Please become familiar with the timings and gates and start to think of a 'planned route' if you have multiple children to drop off/collect across school:

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September 2021 PE kits – Please could you ensure that all children from Y1 – Y6 have both our indoor and outdoor PE kits as outlined in the pictures. Reception children only need the indoor PE kit.

The indoor PE kit should include:

- Plain navy blue shorts with school logo
- Plain white T-shirt with school logo
- Black Pumps

(kit to be left in school throughout each half term)



The outdoor kit should include:

- Plain navy blue hoody with school logo
- Plain navy blue tracksuit pants
- Trainers

No branded or named sportswear is to be worn for PE lessons, other than trainers (eg no Nike tracksuit pants or football shirts etc)

On our PE plan below you will see how children in **Nursery and Reception** will have a lot of time in our school hall. Some of these sessions will be used for a physical 'indoor PE lesson' and some sessions may be used to do other activities. Nursery children do not need an indoor PE kit (just some PE pumps). However, we ask that Reception children do, and that this is kept in school all the time. In having the hall available each day, staff can take a flexible approach with their sessions and with the kit being in school, the children can get changed 'as and when' throughout the week. Children in **Year 3 and Year 4** will start swimming at the Pelican Centre **after February 2022 half term** and, like previous years, on the days classes go swimming they can wear their outdoor PE kit to school. More details about swimming will be provided in the January 2022 newsletter. These PE kits (and all elements of our uniform) are available at Wendy's in Tyldesley and Icon Embroidery in Astley.

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School Uniform reminders:

All uniform and PE kit MUST be named

Jewellery is not allowed although watches may be worn

Ear studs ONLY may be worn but must be removed for PE and swimming

No other body piercing is allowed

No make-up or nail varnish should be worn

Extreme hair styles are not allowed (no shaved lines, no colour other than the child's natural hair colour, hair products such as wax, gel or hairspray should not be applied)

Hair accessories should be of school colours (blue, yellow, white) and minimal in size (no large bows, headbands etc)

No trainers – plain black school shoes only
