Remembrance Events – Wednesday 3rd November was a special day for school as we received our now traditional visit from members of the British Legion. Our week of Remembrance events was rounded off with a fantastic turn out of children and staff at the Remembrance Sunday parade. <u>United Utilities visit</u> – Monday 8th November saw staff from United Utilities come into school to work with children in Year 5 and Year 6 as part of their 'Will I ever see the water I drink again?' Geography topic. Children studied the water cycle and the journey of water from its source to their water bottles. Children also looked at water usage, making water promises to help reduce their impact on the environment.

<u>Poet visit</u> – On Tuesday 9th November Poet, Matt Goodfellow came to visit school for the day. He performed some of his poems in a special assembly and then spent time in each class working with the children. He helped each class create a special poem and talked about how they can find their own voice and use poetry to communicate their feelings. He will be returning to school in the next few weeks to sign copies of his book so look out for a letter about this.



<u>Babies and other children</u> – Please note that tickets for the **school based** performances are for older siblings and adults <u>ONLY.</u> For those who need to bring children, babies or toddlers, a crèche will be provided. This also includes all children from St. George's Central who will have seen all dress rehearsals.

<u>Photographs and digital recording</u> – Under no circumstances are you to use your phone/camera in school or take any photographs during any of the performances, including at the end. We will have already have taken individual/group photographs of the children in their costumes which we will upload to our school Facebook page and my Twitter page (@MrGSGC) so that you can save and print images yourself, in your preferred style at your leisure.



***Please note: all the school based performances on Tuesday 7th December will be filmed by school with final versions being uploaded to our school YouTube page before we break for Christmas. Final links will then be emailed to you and sent via Seesaw.

<u>Costumes</u> – We are hoping to provide costumes within school. If any additional support with costumes is required individual class teachers will let you know.

<u>Christmas cards</u> – This year we are asking that **no Christmas cards are sent into school**. 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
