Staffing updates



Congratulations to **Miss Cowley** who was recently appointed to the Nursery Manager position at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery. Miss Cowley has worked within the early years department at our school since 2014. Miss Cowley will start her role as the nursery manager and will be permanently based at Lancaster Avenue from Monday 1st November 2021. I am sure you will join me in congratulating Miss Cowley on her new role and wish her all the best as we look to further strengthen the links between our Lancaster Avenue Nursery and our school. has recently appeared online as we look to find a suitable Higher Level Teaching Assistant (HLTA) to replace Miss Cowley, working within our early years department in school.

Congratulations also to **Mrs Helme** who was recently appointed to the Deputy Manager position at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery. Mrs Helme joined our nursery from another local school in September and has made a great start to life at Lancaster Avenue. Earlier this week, an advertisement appeared online for a Level 2 Early Years Assistant to work at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery to fill the vacancy we now have with Mrs Helme becoming Deputy Manager.



As we take more steps towards 'normality', the NHS are working hard to 'catch up' with their ever increasing operation 'waiting lists'. This has meant that **Mrs K Toone** has been absent from school for the past few weeks due to having the long awaited operation on her foot. We now have **Miss Fisher** in Year 4CB to cover for this absence, which will continue after the half term break.

During this last week, **Mrs Kearns** received her 'operation' letter which means that from Tuesday 2nd November, she will be absent from school until January 2022. I am sure we will soon see Mrs Kearns up and about after her knee operation. **Mrs S Toone** has already been working alongside Mrs Kearns this year and so we have increased the amount of time that she dedicates to this work each week.

Today is the last day at St. George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery for our caretaker, Mr Ingram. Like many schools, we liaise with an external company, called ISS, when appointing our caretaking and cleaning staff. Mr Ingram has been based at our school since the summer of 2019 and has recently accepted a similar position at a site nearer to his home. ISS will be providing our school with caretaker 'cover' until they have recruited someone to work at our school in a permanent role. Today, Miss Nelson is also leaving our school.
