Throughout the afternoon, they completed some wonderful artwork inspired by the Great Fire, walked down 'Pudding Lane', designed a new city and learned all about

plague doctors. Thank you to Mr Kenny for a memorable experience.

<u>'Shine a Light' Festival</u> – Throughout the Autumn half term, Year 3 and 4 worked alongside Vicky Tyrrell from the Heritage Action Zone (HAZ) project to create their own fantastic lanterns. This linked into Year 3 and 4 work in their Design and Technology topic and was in preparation for the 'Shine a Light' Festival that took place on Tyldesley Square on Saturday 29th October. We were delighted to see so many of our children join us for this



event. We walked from school to the square parading our lanterns. When we arrived at Tyldesley Square, some of children talked about their lanterns on Radio M29. We then enjoyed a pumpkin parade, a dance routine and our school choir provided their own performance. We would like to say a big thank you to Vicky and the 'For Tyldesley' group for including us in this community project.



<u>The Great Big Pumpkin Challenge</u> – Eco-Council members saved 30 unsold pumpkins from Kenyon Hall Farm from being wasted. They challenged each class to create something Eco-friendly in just one week with the winning class being rewarded with an introductory visit to the Forest School later in the year. Mrs Culshaw set high expectations with a pumpkin 'Electric car' carving on wheels and she made pumpkin muffins too. The winning class will be announced soon.



Remembrance Events – Thursday 10th November was a special day for school as we received our traditional visit from members of the British Legion. We would like to thank the members of the Tyldesley British Legion for, yet again, providing an informative talk to the children, helping to ensure that future generations continue to remember the



bravery that members of the armed forces demonstrated in the past and continue to show today. Our week of Remembrance events was rounded off with a fantastic turn out of children and staff at the Remembrance Sunday parade. Again, thank you all for your support with all our Remembrance events.

<u>Anti-Bullying week</u> – Thank you for helping us to celebrate Anti-Bullying Week in a fun and positive way with Odd Socks Day. This years theme for Anti Bullying Week was 'Reach Out'. We wanted to spread a positive message that it is always possible to reach out and ask for help if you are worried about bullying. Children explored why it is important that we are all unique. It was fantastic to see the whole school celebrating their individuality!





<u>Year 3 residential trip</u> – A meeting has recently taken place with parents/carers of children in Year 3 regarding our NEW weekend residential trip to Low Bank Ground. Historically, children in Year 5 and Year 6 have attended this type of trip and so in order to prepare children for these experiences (and for later life in general) we have introduced 'experiences', some away from home, for children in Year 1 to Year 6. I am sure some of

the children (as well as some parents/carers) may have some short term 'nervousness' about these experiences but I believe that the long term benefits for your children being away from home, with their friends in a different environment will be huge!

Eco-Assembly – On Thursday 17th November our newly appointed Eco Council members of 2022 led our whole school assembly with the help of Ellen Hardaker from Wigan Council. They introduced the topics from our current action plan:

- 1. Biodiversity
- 2. School grounds
- 3. Waste (reduce, reuse and recycle)



Ellen then proceeded to help Eco Council to launch their latest 'waste campaign' focusing on reducing, reusing and recycling. We are keen to focus on the topic of waste, particularly what can be recycled in the blue bin and brown bin. Eco Council shared several very full blue bin-recycling sacks. The children wish to reduce how much is printed onto paper and how much is wasted and aim to reuse rather than simply recycle waste paper as much as possible. Next month we will share our results of monitoring the situation. We thank you for your ongoing support with all our Eco campaigns and projects this coming year.



<u>Show your support for England Days</u> – This month will see the return of our 'Show your support for England Days' as the 2022 FIFA World Cup takes place. We will go with the same approach as previous tournaments where on the days that the England team play, instead of wearing their school uniform, children can come to school

<u>Forest School</u> – Although it has not yet been formally opened, this half term Reception children will start to access sessions within our Forest School. Within these sessions they will learn how to whittle sticks using a potato peeler tool and there may even be an opportunity for them to enjoy toasted marshmallows on a real fire! Over the last few months, our Forest School leader, Miss Killian, has been developing our curriculum plans and



risk assessments for the Forest School and so we are currently taking this 'trial' approach with classes so that we can see what works for when we formally open and use this area as part of our curriculum offer.



<u>Autumn Term assessments</u> – During the week commencing Monday 28th November, children in Year 1 – Year 6 will be undertaking end of term assessments in Maths, Reading and SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar). Should you have any questions about these assessments, then please see your child's teacher.

A meeting for Y6 parents/carers to discuss the 2023 Y6 SATs will be taking place on Thursday 8th December at 3:30pm – 4:00pm & 6:00pm – 6:30pm. Mrs Malley will be sending a letter out soon for you to select which session is best for you to attend.

If your child was born between 1st September 2018 and 31st August 2019, you can now submit an application for your



child to start in our Reception class in September 2023. The closing date for admissions is <u>Sunday 15th January 2023</u>. Should your child attend either of our nurseries and you have any questions or if you require any support with completing the form, then please do not hesitate to contact us in school. Should you know anyone with children starting school in September 2023, please let them know that, like every year, I will show people around school on an **individual basis**. Please ask people to ring or email (using the details in the footer of this newsletter) and we will make an appointment to meet with me and have a look round our school.
