Newsletter – Friday 2nd September 2022

Welcome back to the new school year everyone and a special welcome to all our new Nursery and Reception families. I hope you have all had a good summer and have managed to enjoy getting out and about as much as possible. This newsletter contains some useful information, as you prepare for your children returning to (or starting at) our school or one of our nurseries. Over summer, our staff have worked really hard to ensure that everything is in place for your children returning to school. We are always looking at new ways to improve our provision and learning environments so that your children experience the very best and there have been some 'upgrades' and 'additions' that have taken place over summer, including:

-all KS2 classrooms have new carpets in place.

-Year 2BR classroom has new furniture and flooring (in line with the 'style' in place, in Y1NT and Y1/2TL).

-the hall floor has been re-sanded and sealed.

-our Computing Suite has been re-developed.

-a new kitchen has been installed in our Darlington Street Nursery.

-the Forest School area has been 'cleared' and resources are being put in place.

-a security access control system is now in place for all external school gates (see newsletter item below for more information).















The work that was planned to take place on the playground (*lines re-painted and new designs in place*) will now take place later this term. Over the next few weeks, we be having some new 'fixed' outdoor equipment in place at the front of school for our Darlington Street Nursery and children in Reception: EH and there will be some 'fixed' outdoor equipment in place at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery. We will continue to 'never settle for less than *our* best' when it comes to improving our school in all areas.



<u>NEW security access gates</u> – As mentioned above, we have had new security gates installed at all access points to our school (including access to the main school office). As part of this system, we will be able to programme times that certain gates can automatically open and close. As you receive this email, the system is not yet fully completed. The contractors are aiming to have everything ready and in place in time for your children returning on Tuesday. As a result, it is unlikely that we will have our timings in place for the start of

the school day on Tuesday and so please look out for the email that I will send out next week, which will go into detail about how we will be operating this new system.

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Returning to school information: September 2022



<u>Returning to school</u> – On Tuesday 6th September, classroom doors for **children in Year 1 – Year 6**, will open when the first bell rings at **8:45am**. Our second bell will ring at **8:55am** and this will signal to class teachers that they need to close their classroom doors for the start of the school day. All children who are not in school at

this point will need to enter via the main school entrance. Doors will be open for you to collect children at **3:15pm**. During next week home visits will be taking place for children who will be starting at our Darlington Street Nursery and in Reception. When on our school site, in order to ensure everyone is 'safe', we ask that you and your children stick to the paths, keep off any of our school equipment and do not play any 'ball games' on the playground before and after school.



September 2022 PE kits

As per the '3 stars and a wish' feedback, from September 2022, children in Year 1 – Year 6 can come to school in their PE kit on the day that they have outdoor PE and on the day they have indoor PE. The only item of PE kit that will need to remain in school are pumps as children may prefer to walk to school in trainers. So that your child feels 'comfortable' all day in school when it is their indoor PE day (especially on a cold Autumn day), they could wear their full school tracksuit for both days that they have PE (with maybe their shorts underneath on the indoor days). Some children may prefer to come in their shorts on these days. For the first week only, we are asking that:



*On the first day, all children come to school wearing their 'normal' school uniform;

*Children in Y3LK, Y3/4CS and Y4CB come into school wearing their outdoor PE kit on **Wednesday 7**th **September only** and *Children in Y5HJ, Y5/6NC and Y6AM come into school wearing their outdoor PE kit on **Thursday 8**th **September only**.

Outdoor PE kits will not be needed on any other days for children in KS2 during this first week back.

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Meet the Teacher meetings – There is an opportunity for you to come into school to meet, with your child's new teacher next week at our 'Meet the Teacher' meetings. Meetings will start at 3:30pm for those who are able to attend at this time and they will also be repeated at 6pm should this time be more convenient for you. The meetings will last approximately 15 - 30 minutes. For the 3:30pm meetings you can access the classroom via your child's classroom door. If you are attending at 6pm, then please come to the main school entrance. This meeting is for adults only and so all children will be taken to the Computing Suite where you will be able to collect them when the meeting is over. We hope to see you next week:

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Seesaw (Home Learning) – This year, teachers will be continuing with the use of the online platform Seesaw to: communicate with you at home and to set weekly home learning. Please see your child's teacher if you have any difficulties logging on to Seesaw. Children will require a device at home to access their Seesaw account – we

do have some devices in school, which are available for families to loan and so please contact the school

office if your child requires support in order to access their home learning on Seesaw. Paper copies of all home learning will be made available in the classroom for your child to take if they wish. Weekly home learning will be set on a Friday, to be returned for the following Friday. More time will be provided for any longer term 'projects'. <u>Snack options: Nursery and Reception</u> – There is **no snack charge** for all our Nursery and Reception children. Your children will help prepare some of the snacks on offer, which will include cheese and crackers, plain brioche, rice cakes, scotch pancakes and fruit.



<u>Snack options: Year 1 to Year 6</u> — Current options for snack provided by school are: milk and toast. Children can have both or just milk, or just toast. Payment for this is made **half termly in advance**, online using the Tucasi payment system or by cash in the white payment envelopes that are provided. See the Key Dates letter for all payment dates and the emails from school about the different costs. Please note



that your child cannot change options mid-term. If children are not accessing the snack provided by school, the only other snack option is for children to bring their own fresh fruit and plain water (no cereal bars or flavoured drinks/juice). Information regarding school snack has been emailed to you today. All children will receive FREE snack on Tuesday and Wednesday next week. Please ensure you pay online by 3:30pm on Wednesday 7th September for your child to be on the list from Thursday onwards.



<u>Payments to school</u> – Remember that with our Tucasi online payment system, no change will be returned – any funds overpaid will be carried forward to meet future payments. Please send all money into school in the correctly coloured money envelope (available for free from classrooms or the school office).

<u>Pupil information</u> – Next week, we will be sending home our 'official' data collection sheets and health care plans for you to complete and return to school. Our data collection sheets contains all the contact information we currently have on file and so this is an ideal opportunity for you to update any names and numbers. Your child's medical information is included on your child's health care plan and so again, if you could please ensure you update these with the most up to date information. We would appreciate it if you could return these to school as soon as possible so we can update all the information on our school files.





<u>Secondary School applications</u> – On Monday morning next week, all children in Year 6 will walk to Fred Longworth High School for a taster morning. Most Secondary Schools will be organising their 'open evenings' soon. The closing date for Secondary School applications is **Monday 31**st **October 2022** and so make sure you spend the next few weeks having a look at what is on offer within the community.

<u>Welcome to our School Worship</u> – On Friday 16th September, we look forward to welcoming the parents/carers of all our Reception children into school for a special 'Welcome to our School' Worship. Reverend Cath Eccles will lead this special Worship with our Reception children. All Reception family members are welcome to attend this service, which will start at 9:10am. I look forward to seeing you on that morning.





<u>Harvest celebrations in school and church</u> – Children from St. George's Central will start Harvest celebrations in school on Friday 30th September. Reverend Cath Eccles will lead a service at 9:10am involving Reception and KS1 children and the service with KS2 children will start at 2:30pm. Due to the number of classes involved, and the space available, we are unable to safely accommodate any family members at either of these services

on the day. Each class will be contributing to the services, which will be co-ordinated by Mrs Jeffries. Our children are also invited to be part of a Harvest Service at St. George's Church on Sunday 2nd October as part of the 10:00am service – a letter will be sent out about this over the next few weeks. For Harvest gifts this year we are again asking that children bring in a food item from home (please bring these in W/C Monday 26th September) which will be collated for the staff from Atherton and Leigh Foodbank to collect.

- *any Darlington Street Nursery children who do not usually attend Nursery on a Monday morning are invited to bring their child to school at 9:00am to have their photograph taken;
- *any Lancaster Avenue Nursery children who do not usually attend Nursery on a Monday afternoon are invited to bring their child to nursery at 1:00pm to have their photograph taken.

All children will have their photograph taken and a small 'sample' photograph will be sent home for you to decide if you would like to complete any purchases.
