<u>Poetry Together event at Hillcrest</u> – On Friday 3rd November, children in Y6AM took part in the Poetry Together Competition at Hillcrest Residential Care Home.

The initiative was first launched by Her Majesty The Queen in order to bring younger and older generations together to share in the joy of poetry. The children performed six poems by various authors to the elderly residents before sharing tea



and cakes. We were honoured with a special visit from the Lord Lieutenant of Greater Manchester, who shared a poem that she also learned at school. It was an enjoyable morning for everyone involved.



<u>Catalyst Museum trip</u> – On Thursday 9th November, children in Year 5 and Year 6 visited the Catalyst Science Museum, in Widnes. During the visit, the children had the opportunity to explore the interactive galleries and take part in two hands-on workshops based on exploring potions and making a medicine. The children saw some surprising chemical reactions and used their investigative skills to make some potions and observe how they behaved. They also had the opportunity to make and test some different medicines.

Remembrance Sunday — As always, there was an amazing turn out of children and staff at the Remembrance Sunday parade. It is important to ensure that future generations continue to remember the bravery that members of the armed forces demonstrated in the past and continue to show today. As a school, we are proud to be part of this event and so thank you to everyone for your commitment.





<u>Anti-Bullying week</u> – Monday 13th November saw the start of Anti-Bullying Week. The week kicked off with Odd Socks Day. On this occasion, we wore odd socks to celebrate what makes us unique. This year's theme is 'Make a Noise About Bullying' where children considered what bullying means to us, how banter can turn into something more hurtful, and what we can do to stop bullying.

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<u>Year 3 and Year Science Experience Day</u> – Monday 13th November saw our Year 3 and Year 4 children take part in a fun and interactive science day linking to their topic on solids. liquids and gases. The children unleashed their inner scientist, taking part in a range of experiments, including some very colourful investigations!

<u>1960's Workshop</u> – Tuesday 14th November saw children in Key Stage 1 take part in a 1960's workshop to complement their learning in History. They learned about 1960's fashion and famous news events from the 1960's. They also learned about the genres of music and styles of dancing that were popular at the time and they even tried a spot of dancing for themselves. They enjoyed handling some artefacts and from what I hear, their favourite part of the day, was listening to music by The Beatles!





<u>'England Rocks Times Tables Competition'</u> – Earlier this week, **c**hildren in Key Stage 2 engaged in a nationwide competition with thousands of other primary schools. This online times table event reinforced accuracy and recall and aimed to boost confidence in maths as children attempted to answer as many times tables questions as possible, increasing speed, gaining coins and having fun along the way!

<u>Parent/carer workshops</u> – It was great to see so many of you at our Year 3 and Year 4 Reading Workshop earlier this week. Next Wednesday will see Mrs Malley lead the Year 5 and Year 6 Reading Workshop. Looking further ahead, Wednesday 6th December will see our annual *meeting for* Y6 parents/carers to discuss the 2024 Y6 SATs. Mrs Malley will be sending a letter out soon for you to select which session is best for you to attend.





<u>Autumn Term assessments</u> – During the week commencing Monday 27th November, children in Year 1 – Year 6 will be undertaking end of term assessments in Maths, Reading and SPAG (Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar). Should you have any questions about these assessments, then please see your child's teacher.

Reception starters 2024 – The link on the Wigan Council website for 2024 Reception places remains open: Primary School Admissions. If your child was born between 1st September 2019 and 31st August 2020, you can now submit an application for your child to start our Reception class in September 2024. The closing date for admissions is Monday 15th January 2024. Should your child attend either of our



nurseries and you have any questions or if you require any support with completing the form, then please do not hesitate to contact us in school. Should you know anyone with children starting school in September 2024, please let them know that, like every year, I will show people around school on an **individual basis**. Please ask people to ring or email (using the details in the footer of this newsletter) and we will make an appointment to meet with me and have a look round our school.



October half term saw children from our school join with children from seven other schools to attend the ATSA 'All Sports Holiday Provision'. A varied programme of sporting opportunities (Fun Golf and Foot Golf with 'Boomers and Swingers', Multi-skills/Football with Wigan Athletic, Tennis/Multi-Skills with Sphairistrike Tennis and Dance with Abigail Bibby) were on offer over 3 days with children being able to sign up for different days for £4 a day (with lunch included). This also includes all children from St. George's Central who will have seen all dress rehearsals.

<u>Photographs and digital recording</u> – Under no circumstances are you to use your phone/camera in school or take any photographs during any of the performances, including at the end. We will have already taken individual/group photographs of the children in their costumes which we will upload to Seesaw (please see your child's teacher should you require your login details). From Seesaw, you can save and print images yourself, in your preferred style at your leisure. Only a selection of images will be uploaded to our School Facebook page and staff 'X' accounts.



Please note: all the Reception – Year 2 performances on Tuesday 12th December will be filmed by school with final versions being uploaded to our school YouTube page before we break for Christmas. Final links will then be emailed to you and sent via Seesaw. Please let us know by Friday 24th November if you would prefer your child not to be filmed
