
# St George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery

<u>Tree planting on Cutacre Country Park</u> – On Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> February, Miss Cohen took some of our Year 6 children to Cutacre to work alongside the Lancashire Wildlife Trust. They spent the afternoon planting hedgerows on a new part of the reserve and learnt about the importance of hedgerows for nature, wildlife and preservation. <u>Children's Mental Health Week</u> – We celebrated Children's Mental Health Week around this year's theme 'My Voice Matters'. The children learned about the tools we need to express ourselves, no matter who we are or where we are in the world. As part of this celebration, we held a 'Dress to Express' Day where children were welcomed into school wearing an outfit to express their individuality. It was wonderful to see such diversity within our school.





<u>Brathay Hall</u> – Recently, 25 children spent a week at Brathay Hall in the Lake District for the annual Year 5 residential. The children spent the week exploring the countryside, orienteering, ghyll scrambling as well as many other outdoor and adventurous activities. All children enjoyed a Lunar New Year dance experience to celebrate the festivities and different culture. It was a wonderful way to join in celebrations for the year of the dragon!



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<u>Safer Internet Day</u> – Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> February saw us celebrate Safer Internet Day. Even though internet safety is taught throughout the year in school, this day always provides us with an opportunity to remind ourselves of how best to stay safe online. As part of this work, our school was visited by 'Altru Drama' who undertook some online safety workshops in class with children in Key Stage 1. <u>Musical performance</u> – Parents/carers were recently treated to our usual half termly musical performance. As well as hearing the choir sing, it was really good to see all the children who learn instruments in school perform for everyone. The next choir and musical performance in school will be on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> March 2024.

<u>Spring Term parents' evening</u> – Thanks to everyone who attended our Spring Term parents' evenings earlier this week. It was great to see so many of you meet with our teachers as we reach the 'half-way' stage of the school year. This year, we will be continuing with the additional Summer Term parents' evenings, which we introduced last year. Information about these evenings will be sent out to you nearer the time.





<u>World Book Day</u> – On Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March, we will be celebrating World Book Day in school. The theme this year follows the message: 'Our mission is to promote reading for pleasure!' To celebrate this in school, children can come to school in non-uniform and bring in their favourite book to share. We will be receiving a visit from poet, Dominic Berry who will work with classes delivering some creative reading and writing workshops.

<u>British Science Week</u> – Our Science leader, Mrs Malley, will be arranging a variety of Science based activities during week commencing Monday 11<sup>th</sup> March to celebrate British Science Week.





<u>Red Nose Day</u> – We will be supporting Red Nose Day on **Friday 15**<sup>th</sup> **March** by having a non-uniform day for a £1 donation for all children and staff.

<u>Easter Worship/Service</u> – On Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March, there will be an Easter Worship for our school nursery, Reception and Key Stage 1 children in school. Due to space in school, we will be unable to accommodate any parents/carers for this. Our Key Stage 2 Easter Service will take place in St. George's Church at 10:00am on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> March. All members of the St. George's Central community are invited to this service in church. We hope to see you there.





<u>Easter Bingo in school</u> – At 6pm on Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> March, there will be an Easter Bingo event taking place in school. Tickets will be priced at £3 per person or £10 for a family of four. They will be on sale from the school office from **Monday 11<sup>th</sup> March**. Please note, you must bring your ticket with you on the night. To support this event, there will be a non-uniform day in school on **Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> March**, for a donation of an Easter Egg.

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<u>'Kickstarterz' Taster Session</u> – On Monday 29<sup>th</sup> January, some of our Reception children took part in a fun, fitness 'Kickstarterz' Taster Session. This was a great opportunity for some of our children to take part in their first ever 'after school' ATSA event alongside children from other schools.

<u>KS1 Kurling Competition</u> – Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> February, saw our KS1 Kurling team take part in a competition against nine other schools. Well done to the children who represented our school at this event.





<u>Zumba Taster Session</u> – Some Year 3 and Year 4 children took part in a Zumba Taster Session. The session was led by Anna Collins from Astley Zumba.

<u>Flag American Football Taster Session</u> – Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> February, saw some of our children take part in a new ATSA event...Flag American Football. The session was led by James Higham from Leigh Miners American Football Club. There is a further Flag American Football Taster Session taking place in May which will prepare children for the ATSA Flag American Football Competition that will take place in June.



<u>All Sports Holiday Provision</u> – February half term saw children from our school join with children from seven other schools to attend the ATSA 'All Sports Holiday Provision'. A varied programme of sporting opportunities were on offer over 3 days with children being able to sign up for different days for £4 a day (with lunch included)! The programme for the Easter holiday has been finalised and will be advertised next week to children in Year 2 – Year 6.
