
# St George's Central CE Primary School and Nursery

Today is the final school day of 2023. As I look back upon this year, it would be remiss of me to not mention the successful Ofsted inspection that took place in June 2023. Things move quickly and much has happened in the six months since the inspectors visited our school. We have continued to adapt to changing circumstances, both in school and the community, as our quest to continually improve and provide the best for your children is always at the forefront of our minds. I thank you for your continued support and look forward to seeing you in 2024 where we will continue to offer excellent facilities and high quality experiences to support positive relationships and provide the best education for your children.

<u>Staffing updates</u> – Today is the final day at St. George's Central for both Miss Killian and Mr Simmons as they both embark on new challenges in 2024. We are sad to see them both leave and thank them for their hard work during their time at our school. As parents/carers of children in Miss Killian's class already know, from January 2024, Reception: TK will become **Reception: OB** as our Deputy Headteacher, Mrs O'Brien, becomes a Reception teacher. Again, as parents/carers of children in Mr Simmons' class know, Year 2CS will become **Year 2VG**, as Miss Gray becomes the class teacher in this class. Both Mrs O'Brien and Miss Gray will remain in these roles until the end of the school year, with **Mrs Duncan** joining our school in January to cover classes across school and teach in Year 2VG each Friday. Also in January, **Mrs Skinner**, from our Lancaster Avenue Nursery, will come to work at our Darlington Street Nursery providing cover in our Reception classes, as Miss Davies prepares to start her maternity leave in February 2024.


2024 will see St. George's Central continue to offer your children a rich and varied range of opportunities: please ensure they are in school on time every day, so they do not miss out!

<u>Year 1 'sleepover'</u> – Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November saw some of our Year 1 children return to school for a fun-filled sleepover in our school hall. The children had a great time dancing to their favourite songs and playing party games before settling down for supper and a movie. The following morning, the children enjoyed breakfast in the hall before going home for a much needed rest. A fantastic time was had by all.

**<u>Road Safety Week</u>** – Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November saw the start of Road Safety Week with the theme 'Let's talk about speed'. The children have learned important road safety messages, including why safe speeds are so vital for safe and healthy journeys. The Mental Health Ambassadors have designed and displayed posters to share this knowledge with our school community.

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<u>Visit to St. George's Church</u> – Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> November saw our Reception classes enjoy a visit to St. George's Church for the morning. During the visit they performed songs from their Christmas nativity and heard the Christmas story. The children listened as Rector Martin, our Reception governor, shared information about the important work he undertakes in church and the community.

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<u>Library visits</u> – Over the last few weeks, different classes across school have visited Tyldesley Library. They have enjoyed looking around the library, learned about how to lend books and have taken part in colouring competitions and craft activities. 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#### Musical performances and school choir events



Parents/carers of children in Year 4 were recently treated to a tuned percussion performance from the children in Y4EH and Y4NC. Our school 'buys in' to the Wigan Music Service 'Wider Opportunity Music' scheme which means that each week a specialist music teacher (Mrs Lord) comes into our school to teach the children to play musical instruments. Our children learn to play a different

percussion instrument each term – this term, the children have been learning to play plastic percussion instruments, such as the bamboo tamboo and the cups. It was a great performance from the children. After Christmas, the children will be learning to play a different percussion instrument and there will be another whole school performance just before Easter.

Our school choir has been involved in a few events over the last few weeks. Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> November saw our children taking to the stage in Tyldesley Market Square to mark the switching on of the Christmas lights. The children performed brilliantly, singing a variety of traditional and more popular Christmas songs in front of an extremely large audience. Last week, the children sang at the Rotary Club Community Carol Service at St. George's Church. It was great to see our children sing: *'When Christmas Comes to Town'* and *'Rockin' Around* 



the Christmas Tree'. It is pleasing to see how our school continues to takes a central role in all community-based events.



Additionally, this week, our half-termly musical performance took place with our choir being joined by our musicians from across school so that they could perform to the many visitors who came along. As well as hearing the choir sing, it was great to see some of the children who learn instruments in school perform for everyone. The next musical performance in school will be on **Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> February 2024**.

<u>Table Tennis Taster Session</u> – On Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November, children from St. George's Central joined with children from seven other schools to take part in a Table Tennis Taster Session at Fred Longworth High School.
