'Water Protectors' Artist Workshop – Children in Y5 and Y6 took part in an art and environment workshop with artist, historian and climate guru, Anna Smith. The creative session explored the vital role of water in our everyday lives and the collection, preservation and distribution of water.

Year 6 Drama Workshops with Royal Exchange Theatre Group – Children in Year 6 took part in a drama workshop with Julia, a local theatre maker. Darts Taster Sessions – At the start of the term, children in Year 3 – Year 6 took part in a Darts Taster Session with GM Darts Coaching coaches, James and Arran. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about how to play darts. They learned about how to position themselves when playing darts, and how to throw the darts to get the best score. Year 5 and Year 6 Shakespeare Workshop – As part of learning in English and History, Year 5 and Year 6 children received a visit from 'As Creatives'. The children took part in some structured drama activities to re-tell the stories of Shakespeare's plays.



Open afternoons and 'Stay and Play' sessions – Thank you to everyone who came to our 'Open Afternoons' earlier this week. Our next round of 'Stay and Play' sessions across Early Years classes, will take place **during the week commencing Monday 9th February**. Staff across Early Years will make you aware of the sessions available during that week and so please see Miss Cowley at our Lancaster Avenue Nursery or your child's teacher at our school site, to sign up to a session.

To celebrate the start of **Children's Mental Health Week**, there will be a 'Dress to Express' Day on **Monday 2nd February** where children will be welcomed into school wearing an outfit to express their uniqueness. Children may choose to dress in a colour to express how they are feeling or an outfit to represent their favourite things. This year's theme is 'This is My Place', celebrating the importance of belonging in our communities. Throughout the week, we will explore activities that help children feel safe, valued, and connected—whether at home, with friends, or in school.



Friday 6th February will see us come together as a school to mark '**Heart Month**'. On this day, children can come to school wearing something red with a £1 donation for the 'Healing Little Hearts' charity.

Friday 13th February will see us come together as a school to mark **International Childhood Cancer Day**. On this day, children can come to school wearing something orange with a £1 donation for The Azaylia Foundation. Over the day, children will be learning about the brave children, adolescents and families that are affected by cancer and how we can show support as a community.

School Swimming – Our children in Year 3 and Year 4 will start school swimming lessons at The Pelican Centre after February half term. For parents/carers of children in **Year 4CB**, it is worth noting that the children will be attending their first swimming session on the **first day back after February half term**. World Book Day – On Thursday 5th March, we will be celebrating World Book Day in school. This is an annual celebration of authors, illustrators, books and the joy of reading. To celebrate this in school, children can come to school in non-uniform and bring in their favourite book to share. We will be receiving a visit from poet, Dommy B who will work with classes delivering some creative reading and writing workshops.



'Access to Success' Basketball Competition – Thursday 8th January saw our children take part in an 'Access to Success' Basketball Competition at Rowan Tree, competing against children from seven other schools. Well done to our team.



Football leagues – Our children are taking part in the Tyldesley section of both the mixed football league and girls' football league. Matches have been taking place over the last few weeks at Fred Longworth each Monday and Friday. Our mixed team have already played two games (winning one match and drawing one match) and they are due to play their next two games today. The girls will start their matches in February.
