Feedback from Lower Key Stage 2 children about Art and Design (July 2022)

General questions about Art and Design

Children from Lower Key Stage 2 have feedback on Art and Design. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is Art and Design about?

- You get to show your passion in different ways.
- Everyone can take part.
- It doesn't matter if other people don't like it, it's how you express yourself.

Why is Art and Design important?

- It can help to calm you down if you are feeling sad or angry.
- It allows you to express yourself.

Tell me about your favourite piece of work in Art and Design and tell me why you enjoyed learning about this

- The portrait of the Queen for the Jubilee Celebrations.
- I enjoyed sketching people.
- I enjoyed making observational drawings and adding details and decorations.
- I enjoyed mixing colours to paint and adding gems and glitter to decorate.

Are there any areas in Art and Design that you are still unsure about?

Not really – but I would like to get better at making 3D sculptures.

How do you know if you are doing well in Art and Design?

- I might think that my work is really good.
- People will tell me that they like my work.
- The Super Artist Award.

What happens if you are finding work difficult in Art and Design?

- Teachers will demonstrate different techniques and give you tips to help you.
- Friends help me.
- Teachers encourage and support us to keep trying.

What do you need to do to improve your learning in Art and Design?

- Keep on practising to get better.
- Listen to teacher when he/she models examples.

In the Spring Term, you completed some work on Sculpture in Art and Design, what can you tell me about it?

- Using tin foil made the sculptures easier to mould and shape than using clay.
- We looked at the work of Alberto Giacometti. He made sculptures of animals and people in clay.

If you were to complete this work again, what would you do differently?

• Try to make the human in a simpler position as I found this tricky.

Can you explain what some of this Art and Design vocabulary means?

Clay: you can mould it like playdough and it dries hard – partially correct

Knead: roll and stretch the clay – partially correct

Texture: If something is rough or smooth. What something feels like – correct

Sculpture: a 3D shape – correct

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Feedback from Lower Key Stage 2 children about Art and Design (July 2022) Subject specific questions about Art and Design

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What can you tell me about the artist Alberto Giacometti that you have studied?

- He is a Swiss sculptor.
- He is famous for making sculptures of human figures.
- He lived in Paris.
- The figures he made were all thin.

What can you tell me about his sculptures?

- He made animals and people.
- They were stood/sat in different positions.
- All of his figures were thin.
- His ideas came from people hurrying in big cities.

Can you talk me through the journey to creating your final piece?

- Visited an art gallery in the classroom to look at the work of Alberto Giacometti.
- We learned about him and his work.
- We did a thought and response sheet on one of his figures.
- We sketched some of his different figures.
- We drew each other in the style of his figures posing in different positions to think of our own design for a sculpture of a human figure.
- We practised moulding foil and bending wire.
- We chose our favourite design and made it using wire and tin foil.

What do you like about your final piece?

- It was a thin figure like Alberto Giacometti's figures.
- The top part of the figure had a good shape.

How could you improve or develop it further?

- I would have chosen an easier position as I found it hard to mould into shape.
- I would have made the legs longer.

Action to take as a result of Pupil Feedback on Art and Design

- Provide more opportunities for children to revisit work from previous units to make links with artists, skills, techniques and processes.
- Ensure key vocabulary is display and referred to in order to embed into long term memory.
