



Feedback from children about Eco (June 2022)

General questions about Eco

Children from Early Years have feedback on Eco. Some of the questions asked may have been slightly re-worded so they were accessible to children of all ages

What is Eco Council about?
It is helping look after the school.
Why is Eco Council important?
It is a grown up job for Mr Grogan and he wants you to do grown up jobs ready for Year one.
Tell me about your favourite project with Eco Council?
When we had pumpkins, we smashed them, Mrs Culshaw made pumpkin pie and pumpkin cake. We took the middle out and then made a bird feeder. Lots of Eco people came to our room to pick a pumpkin, they were really tall and they said Eco is good you help people in school. Mrs Culshaw likes it when we have helped Eco Council dig up food in the garden for her to cook, it is cheaper and healthier than the shop.
Are there any areas within Eco Council that you are unsure about?
How we join it in Year 1.
How do you know if you are doing well with Eco Council?
You are happy and more people come to our room asking for litter pickers and the bags. We do litter picking at lunchtime.
What happens if you are finding feeding back to your class difficult with Eco council, who could you go to for support?
Our teachers or Miss Derighetti, Mrs Tuffin or Mrs Hupton.
What did we do for the 'Walk to School Campaign', what can you tell me about it?
We used travel tracker more, travel tracker is where you tell the teacher how you get to school and get a badge for walking or park and stride. You are helping the planet and saving it. You can go on a bike or scooter that's healthy.
If you had to run travel tracker in class how would you do it?
I would make sure I did it every single day and teach the children how to record the journeys without an adult like we do for choosing lunch.
Can you explain what some of this Eco Council vocabulary means?
Reuse – I don't know. Incorrect Reduce – I don't know. Incorrect Recycle – To collect empty milk bottles or paper and reuse them. Correct Environment – Is it the classroom? We look after the classroom and tidy it up. Nearly correct Litter – If you drop rubbish on the floor you have to pick it up, we have litter pickers so you don't use your hands as that might be dangerous. Correct
Can you think where Eco Council links to things that you have learned before in your class or with a different teacher?
We helped Mrs Davies with the Queens Jubilee garden, we water the plants, we grow things for Mrs Culshaw.

Subject specific questions about Eco Council

How can we look after our school?
Look after the teachers, buy them food and help them with jobs. We could keep the toilet tidy and flush the toilet.
How can we reduce litter in our school?
Put rubbish in the right bin.

I want the biscuits, do we get jaffa cakes?

Action to take as a result of Pupil Feedback on Eco Council

Ensure children in EYFS have an awareness of what ECO council is and the role ECO council play in making the school more ECO friendly.

Ensure children in EYFS start to correctly use some of the 'Eco Vocabulary' – Re-use, Reduce etc.
